2023 HOMECOMING



ELECTIONS:

- 1. All recognized organizations may elect to have a Homecoming King and/or Queen nominee.
- 2. Freshmen and sophomore students are eligible to be homecoming nominees.
- 3. All nominees' nomination forms are due by 5 PM on Tuesday, September 26 via orgsync.tjc.edu/forms
 - a. The entry fee is \$40 per couple or \$20 per person
- 4. All homecoming nominees must attend a **MANDATORY** campaign meeting on Tuesday, September 26 at 4 PM in Jenkins Hall, room 1109.
- 5. All homecoming nominees must attach a digital headshot to the online application.
 - a. A headshot is a tightly, cropped photo of the face and shoulders. **Selfies will NOT be accepted.**
 - b. Nominees can get their photo taken at the Digital Media Lab, located in the library, on Thursday Sept. 28th 10 AM 7 PM.
- 6. Homecoming nominees **MUST** be full-time students (enrolled in 12 hours or more), be in good standing academically (cumulative 2.0 GPA or higher) with no prior code of conduct violations.
- 7. Voting will take place on Monday, October 9 Wednesday, October 11 from 9 AM 4 PM at Rogers Student Center, Jenkins Hall, and online via OrgSync.
 - a. TJC Students must be enrolled in the Fall 2023 semester to vote in the election and can only vote once.
- 8. "Most Beautiful" and "Most Handsome" will be chosen from overall Homecoming court nominees at the "Campus Capers" Talent Show and will be presented at the football game before the announcement of our Top 5 Homecoming King and Queen nominees.
- 9. Fifty points will be given toward the "Warrior Spirit Award" to the organization for each homecoming nominee, king or queen. Fifty additional points will be awarded to the organization for each nominee that is chosen to be in the Top 5.

COMPETITIONS:

Each organization that wishes to compete in Homecoming competitions must sign up by 5 PM by Tuesday, September 26 to enter. All organizations participating in any of the competitions must attend a MANDATORY homecoming meeting on Tuesday, September 26 at 4 PM in Jenkins Hall, room 1109.

A. OFFICE DECORATING

- Any recognized organization may decorate a designated office, department or residence hall lobby and receive a \$100.00 reimbursement to help cover the cost of decorations. All receipts must be returned to CSLI on Monday, October 16 by 5 PM.
- 2. Judging will take place on Tuesday, October 10.
 - a. Office decorations will be judged on the use of TJC/Organization, illustration of theme, creativity and overall appearance, as well spaces must still be able to function as normal.
- 3. One hundred points will be given toward the "Warrior Spirit Award" to those who participate in the Office Decorating competition. First place winners will receive an additional one hundred points, second place will receive seventy-five points and third place will receive fifty points.

B. SPIRIT BANNER

- 1. Any recognized organization may decorate a spirit banner and must submit the banner by 5 PM on Monday, October 9.
- 2. Spirit Banners will be provided to the organization, with a select set of paint colors.
 - b. If desired, additional colors may be used but the organization or its members must cover expenses for these supplies.
- 3. Judging will take place on Tuesday, October 10.
 - a. Spirit banners will be judged on the use of TJC/Organization, illustration of theme, creativity and overall appearance, as well as all banners MUST be designed to hang vertically.
- 4. Fifty points will be given toward the "Warrior Spirit Award" to those who participate in the Spirit Banner competition. First place winners will receive an additional one hundred points, second place will receive seventy-five points and third place will receive fifty points.

C. SUPPLY DRIVE

- 1. Non-perishable food and supplies will be measured by number of items the organization. Only the food and supplies listed below will be accepted and no refrigerated items will be accepted.
- 2. Food or supplies must be new and cannot be opened or damaged, nor in glass containers and within expiration dates listed on the packaging.
- 3. All proceeds will be donated to the Student Resource Center, located in Pirtle Technology, Room 214. To help fulfill their needs, we will only accept the following items:
 - School supplies (spiral notebooks, note cards, and highlighters)
 - Meat products (such as jerky, Vienna sausages, or single serve chicken or tuna)
 - Canned meals or fruit (such as spaghetti, ravioli, peaches, pears, etc.)
 - Granola bars
 - Microwavable meals: Ramen cups (no flat packs), mac & cheese cups, oatmeal cups, soup cups or other individually portioned, microwaveable cups, pasta bowls and popcorn
 - Hygiene items (soap, toilet paper, deodorant, shampoo/conditioner, feminine products, etc.).
 - Laundry pods
- 4. Food and supplies can be dropped off at the CSLI, located on the 2nd floor of Rogers Student Center, starting Monday, October 9 at 9 AM until 5 PM on Wednesday, October 11.
- 5. One point will be given for each donated item or supply to determine the winning organization.
- 6. One hundred and fifty points will be given toward the "Warrior Spirit Award" to those who participate in the supply drive competition. First place winners will receive an additional one hundred points, second place will receive seventy-five points and third place will receive fifty points.

D. FLOAT

- 1. Any recognized organization may decorate a float to transport its Homecoming Nominee(s) in the Apache Nation Parade and receive a \$50.00 reimbursement to help cover the cost of supplies. All receipts must be returned to CSLI on Monday, October 16 by 5 PM.
- 2. Student Life will notify the approved driver when the golfcart keys are available for pick up.
- 3. Judging will take place at 5 PM on Thursday, October 12, prior to the Apache Nation Parade at the RNHS parking lot.
- 4. Floats will be displayed at the Homecoming Block Party, so please DO NOT clean off your float until after 8 PM. Juan Lesser will be stationed by the floats to ensure they are completely cleaned and to return the ID in exchange for the golf cart key.
- 5. Two hundred points will be given toward the "Warrior Spirit Award" to those who participate in the float competition. First place winners will receive an additional one hundred points, second place will receive seventy-five points and third place will receive fifty points.

E. CAMPUS CAPERS

- 1. Tryouts for Campus Capers will be held on Sept. 20 from 2 4 PM and Sept. 21 from 4 6 PM.
- 2. If chosen, groups must perform the routine or song at Campus Capers as performed at tryouts.
 - a. Groups MUST also present a roster at rehearsal and every performer must be a current TJC student (NO SUBSTITUTIONS).
- 3. Groups are judged by individuals selected by the Center for Student Life and Involvement and up to ten groups may be selected to perform at the show.
- 4. Music and lyrics must have NO offensive or vulgar language and all acts MUST be a family friendly performance.
- 5. All chosen acts MUST attend the come-and-go rehearsal from 1:30 4:30 PM on Monday, October 9 in RPPAC, Wise Auditorium.
- 6. The chosen acts will perform at Campus Capers Talent Show in RPPAC, Wise Auditorium at 7 PM on Tuesday, October 10. All performers must be there when doors open at 6:30 PM!
- 7. Prizes that will be awarded are \$500 for first place, \$200 for second place, and \$100 for third place.

F. DRUM BEAT

The Homecoming Drum Beat started in 1948 and it is an unbroken tradition since that time. The drum beats to the Apache Cadence 24 hours a day starting on Monday of Homecoming Week and continues until kickoff at the game on Saturday. Voting will take place from 9 AM – 4 PM via orgsync.tjc.edu. Polling locations will be located at Rogers Student Center Information Desk and Jenkins Hall, 1st floor. Campaign tables may be provided during these hours and will be available on a first come, first serve basis at RSC.
