Await notification of acceptance to the program and additional information about the background check and drug screen. Official notification will be via official Tyler Junior College email only.

## **Required Vaccinations and Documentation**

Students preparing to enter the paramedic program must provide documentation of immunizations and/or serological documentation of immunity for the following conditions. This documentation is required by the State as well as our clinical affiliates and is IN ADDITION to what you may have been required to submit for admission to Tyler Junior College. Use the list below to help you make sure you obtain the correct documentation.

**Negative** TB skin test within 12 months of the start of the program. **PLEASE NOTE** if the skin test is positive (for any reason) you must then provide evidence of a "normal" chest x-ray. If you have a documented allergy to the test and cannot have a skin test as a result of that allergy then you must also provide evidence of a "normal" chest x-ray.

MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) IGG Titer, lab reports are required

Varicella Zoster (chicken pox) IGG Titer, lab reports are required

**Tetanus/Diptheria/Pertussis** (Tdap) booster given within 10 years of your application date. <u>PLEASE NOTE</u> if your booster is older than 10 years or you cannot find the record documenting the date of your booster you must provide a titer lab report as evidence of immunity.

Hepatitis B series completion record (3 shots) OR signed declination form (can decline for religious or allergic reasons but this must be verifiable).

**Hepatitis B Titer, Surface Antibody**, if your original series was completed more than 5 years prior to your application date **OR**if you have recently finished the series to ensure you are immune (generally the titer is checked 60 days after the third injection)

Bacterial Meningitis Vaccine (MCV4) shot record from physician OR titer laboratory results. <u>PLEASE NOTE</u>, as of Fall 2012, this is a requirement to enter any Texas college.

## $Seasonal\ Influenza\ Immunization-\underline{MANDATORY}$

Available in August for fall semester and is due on or before September 30<sup>th</sup>. Documentation of immunization must be included in the "required vaccination documentation" for spring semester program.

10-panel urine drug screen with urine alcohol performed by program specified lab<sup>2</sup>

Criminal background check performed by program specified vendor<sup>3</sup>

This documentation is essential to your success and completion of the paramedic program. If you have questions about the acceptance of certain documentation items, contact the EMSP office BEFORE you submit your application. Otherwise, your application could be rejected.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup>The antibody titer is a blood test that detects the presence and measures the amount of antibodies within a person's blood. The amount and diversity of antibodies correlates to the strength of the body's immune response. In short, documents that you are immune to a particular illness.
